Why is there a need for World Sustainable Contracting Day (WSCD)?

We understand that while many events relating to sustainability do exist, there is currently no event specifically designed to address the crucial role of contracts in achieving sustainability goals. We have identified a tremendous appetite to learn from what others are doing in their contracting and commercial practices through real world case studies from across sectors, showcasing best practice from around the world.

World Sustainable Contracting Day enables knowledge share on a global scale. Following the sun, the event is free and totally inclusive to all, with closed captions available in 11 different languages.

What's the impact?

Three years on we continue to see the impact of WSCD though our impact survey.

Three years ago, only half of respondents were sure of the role they could play in achieving sustainability goals - today that's now 93%. Inspiration to act within their organization or community continues to grow – from 88% in 2022 to 95% in 2024. Today almost 98% of respondents believe that contract professionals can make a significant impact on sustainability. Finally, it's hugely encouraging that 82% now feel that WSCD showed them how to take more action within their organization or community, compared with just 50% last year.

Academic Symposium

The theme for our 2023 Symposium was **Proactive Contracting and the Law.** This is one of our most significant events of the year. It is designed to bring academia and industry leaders together to identify crucial gaps in research and to provide a rich and fertile ground for new research to begin.

By partnering with prestigious universities such as Oxford, Stanford, Northwestern and Rutgers, the Symposium creates a unique platform where practitioners and scholars convene to exchange ideas and insights, to challenge conventional thinking, and to explore new opportunities. This intersection enriches the thinking in both spheres and stimulates research initiatives that can help drive us toward our collective mission.

Over the last two years we have focused our drive to advance sustainable and inclusive contracting and commercial practices. The theme of our 2023 Symposium was **Proactive Contracting and the Law** and it attracted 609 registrations from 463 companies, across 68 countries. We had the support of 18 different academic partners.

Our Symposiums empower professionals and academics to pioneer changes that benefit businesses, economies, and societies worldwide.

We can see a clear link between events like this and the evolution of contracting practices through the increasing number of newly developed, proactive strategies. By bridging the gap between theory and practice, our annual Academic Symposiums play a vital role in shaping the future, empowering professionals and academics to pioneer changes that benefit businesses, economies, and societies worldwide.

2023 marked the third year of the Inspiring Women program, during which we proudly welcomed a new group of inspirational leaders. The program now embraces 58 incredible individuals, across 19 countries. This program continually enriches our community by providing a platform to share experiences, insights, and strategies. We have now held 24 virtual events – attracting over 4,160 registrations!

In addition to these events, we have also curated three books that serve as testaments to the brilliance and resilience of these women. These publications stand as tangible embodiments of our commitment to amplifying their achievements and celebrating their remarkable contributions.

All in all, we hope to inspire future generations to pursue their ambitions with confidence and determination.

Economic empowerment of women

Empowering women in trade is essential for fostering economic growth and reducing poverty. Women make up a significant proportion of the global workforce yet too often they face barriers to entry and advancement. By providing women with access to training, finance and market opportunities they can become more competitive and successful, creating jobs and increasing incomes.

Massive Open Online Course

Our Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) in contract management and business relationships is a transformative educational course we developed with Southampton University. It is backed by the UK government.

This free, three-week course which is run twice yearly is designed to grant individuals with limited or no contracting experience, an opportunity to understand the contract management process and gain confidence in developing new contracts and building successful business relationships.

This course stands as a testament to our commitment to accessible, high-quality education, aiming to democratize knowledge and foster a more informed and capable global business community. By leveraging the support of Southampton University and the UK government, we ensure that our MOOC, hosted by FutureLearn, delivers content that is both relevant and impactful, addressing the evolving needs of today's business landscape.

Commercial **Awareness Program**

At its heart, the Commercial Awareness Program aims to equip individuals with critical insights to navigate the complexities of modern commerce.

Through this program, it is our ambition to empower thousands of people around the world, specifically groups of people that may not have had access to this level of commercial training before, but require an understanding of the overall contracting process. We see people from all walks of life benefiting from this program – entrepreneurs running local shops or startups looking to expand and understand the financial landscape better, individuals in

emerging markets who are wanting to start or grow their own businesses and need foundational knowledge of commercial practices, or even artisans and craftspeople in developing countries aiming to enhance their business skills and market their products more effectively. Ultimately, the Commercial Awareness Program will help drive better, more inclusive trading relationships for everyone.

Contracting Principles

The WorldCC Contracting Principles have been developed and endorsed by World Commerce & Contracting and promoted as an open source tool by WorldCC Foundation.

They are intended to serve as an international cross-sector set of guidelines to support the drafting of applicable contract clauses and / or the negotiation of applicable terms and conditions between a customer and a supplier. These Principles can be used to reduce or eliminate the need for negotiation and shorten cycle time to signature.

Those who wish to adopt these WorldCC Contracting Principles are free to use them in their entirety or on a more selective basis as they deem appropriate. However, it is expected that the benefits of their use will be maximized when both parties to a transaction agree to rely on them and draft and negotiate the relevant clauses accordingly.








Contract Design Pattern Library

The Library has a wide range of patterns (topics), helpfully arranged by category, key words and even the problems they solve.




Over the course of its life, from 2019 to present day, 64,990 individuals have accessed the resources the Contract Design Pattern Library provides.

The WorldCC Foundation was established in September 2022 and the U.S. Internal Revenue Service recognized it as a section 501(c)(3) public charity in October 2023.

We are a young organization with transformative ideas and an ambition for growth. And we will need to grow if we are to make a substantive contribution to building a world where all trading relationships deliver social and economic benefit.

Currently, as you'll see from the income and expenditure statement on the right, we are running at a deficit (which is being financed by the WorldCC Association). Our plans call for increases in both income and expenditure, and for the elimination of the deficit. We expect to become financially independent by 2024/2025. Watch this space!

The path ahead: Sustainability Clause Library

The Sustainability Clause Library is a global initiative designed to support and accelerate the integration of Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) principles into the core of commercial contracts. This comprehensive repository of contractual clauses will promote sustainability, social value, and the realization of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs) through the power of contracts and the contracting process.

By providing free access to high-quality, sustainabilityfocused provisions, the Library supports embedding ESG principles and practices into their agreements.

The objectives of the Library include aiding users in incorporating effective sustainability provisions, offering a collaborative platform for clause contribution, and enhancing the efficiency and consistency of drafting these clauses. Ultimately, this contributes to the WorldCC Foundation's vision of achieving both social and economic benefit through all trading relationships.

At the heart of ESG is the recognition of the responsibilities held by organizations to operate sustainably and ethically. This includes considering their impact on the environment, employees, customers, suppliers, and communities. The UN SDGs, endorsed by the UN General Assembly in 2015, represent a collective global commitment to sustainable development, with an urgent call to action underscored by the 2023 SDG Summit's focus on accelerated progress.

The Library's impact extends beyond a purely legal view of contract terms, encouraging a culture of shared responsibility within and across sectors. By fostering sustainable contracting practices, the Library contributes to improved quality of life, economic empowerment, and environmental stewardship, particularly in developing countries where such practices can significantly enhance resilience against climate change, human rights abuse and promote sustainable livelihoods.


Research conducted by WorldCC in early 2024, with input from 105 organizations, indicates that when incorporating ESG clauses in contracts, contentious issues appear to be less about the principles that underlie ESG, than they are about the practicality of compliance and the extent to which this should be a shared responsibility (see chart).

Sustainability impacts society as a whole, and therefore, achieving ESG targets depends on shared responsibility and collaborative action.

The Sustainability Clause Library is a vital tool for accelerating the integration of sustainability into business and commercial practices, fostering shared responsibility, supporting the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, and ensuring a healthier, more equitable future for generations to come.




